## ANNEXING OUR LAND!!!

#### What is annexation?

The illegal use of force by one State to incorporate the territory of another state into its own territory.

What does Israel Annexation Imply? Israel started its annexation of Jerusalem in 1967, and its current plans to further annex lands belonging to the State of Palestine. This is a denial of Palestinian national and human rights. It is a threat to peace and stability in the region.

#### UN position?

UN Secretary-General says that the annexation would constitute a most serious violation of international law and would grievously harm the prospect of a two-State solution. He called on the Israeli Government to abandon its annexation plans.

#### EU position?

Almost every EU member state opposes Israel's annexation plans. II European Foreign Ministers urged to list options to 'deter' Israel's plan and more than 1,000 European MPs called for Israel annexation to be halted and warn of 'consequences'.

#### **SETTLEMENTS**

Israel's Settlement Council in the occupied West Bank has announced the development of 164 new housing units in Neve Daniel settlement to the west of the occupied West Bank city of Bethlehem. This settlement expansion is part of the construction of a new settlers' compound inside the illegal settlement\*. It is part of Israel's expansion of the city of Jerusalem, which it now calls "Greater Jerusalem".

Also, a new road for Israeli settlers is being built illegally by the Israeli occupation forces on Palestinian land in the village of Nahalin, west of Bethlehem.

\*Based on the result of numerous UN resolutions that cite Article 49 of the Geneva Convention, the consensus view of the international community is that Israeli settlements are illegal and constitute a violation of international law

# CHRISTIAN PRESENCE UNDER THREAT

As many as 13 church leaders in the occupied city of Jerusalem yesterday warned that the Israeli court's decision concerning the Greek Orthodox Church's property at Jaffa Gate threatens the Christian presence in the holy city.

In a joint statement, they said: "We. the Heads of The Churches and Christian Jerusalem, Communities in stand united OHE commitment to safeguard the historical Status Quo of the Holy Sites and rights of the Churches which are universally recognized. The case of Jaffa Gate threatens this Status Quo."

# PALESTINE & COVID 19

#### **CURRENT STATUS**

On July 12, the Palestinian government imposed a night-time and weekend curfew on the occupied West Bank for the following 14 days to try and rein in rising coronavirus numbers. Travel will be prohibited daily from 8:00 pm to 6:00 am in all governorates," as well as from Thursday evening to Sunday morning

There have so far been over 6,150 confirmed cases of COVID 19 infection, with 37 dead.

# IMPACT ON PALESTINIAN ECONOMY

An abrupt decline in economic activities and pressure on the Palestinian finances have placed Palestinian livelihoods at high risks, as the impact of the Coronavirus (COVID-19) continues to hit the economy hard. After growth of a mere 1% in 2019, the economy is projected to contract by at least 7.6% in 2020.

The primary results of the IIP (external assets foreign liabilities) for Palestine at the end of the first quarter 2020 revealed that the net IIP amounted lo USD 1.763 million, decreased by 16% compared with previous quarter.

### SOLIDARITY with Palestinian Prisoners

On the occasion of the International Day in support of victims of Torture, the embassy of Palestine in Hungary circulated a press statement-issued by the Palestinian Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Expatriates.

"Palestinian detainees have been subjected to terror, insecurity, and injustice under the ongoing Israel colonial prolonged occupation..." The statement "currently, Israeli occupation forces detain over 4600 Palestinians; including 180 children, 39 women and 373 under arbitrary administrative detention. They languish in Israeli detention centres breach of international law. They are subjected to torture methods, solitary confinement, and other inhumane practices under illegal military Israeli system. Furthermore. Israel the occupying power, still withholds the bodies of 268 Palestinian martyrs in violation of article 130 of Fourth Geneva Convention and article 34 of the first Additional Protocol."

### BIODIVERSITY IN PALESTINE

There are about 51 thousand living species (flora and fauna) in historical Palestine, constituting around 3% of global biodiversity.

In the State of Palestine, there are an estimated 30,848 animal species, consisting of an estimated 30 thousand invertebrates, 373 birds, 297 fish, 92 mammals, 81 reptiles and 5 amphibians.
