ISRAELI PRESIDENT STORMS AL-IBRAHIMI MOSQUE

On November 28, the Israeli president Isaac Herzog stormed the Ibrahimi Mosque in the occupied West Bank city of Hebron, in a move of clear declaration of his sponsorship of the Jewish settlers' plans.

Israeli forces closed the mosque gates, and prevented Palestinian residents from praying or standing nearby, they further forced the shop owners to close their shops, hindered the work of the press crews, and assaulted a number of them in an attempt to prevent them from covering the intrusion.

The Israeli president lit the first candle of the Jewish Hanukkah holiday at the Ibrahimi Mosque accompanied by settler leaders.

UN HIGH COMMISSIONER FOR HUMAN RIGHTS: SITUATION IN PALESTINE IS DISASTROUS

On December 7, the UN High Commissioner for Human Rights, Michelle Bachelet, said during a meeting organized by the United Nations Committee on the Inalienable Rights of the Palestinian People:

"Overall, the present human

rights situation in the Occupied Palestinian Territory can fairly be characterized as disastrous, with severe infringements on the rights of over 4 million people."
"Only an end to the occupation can bring about lasting peace and establish the conditions in which the human rights of all can be fully respected," Bachelet added.

PLANS TO BUILD 9,000 SETTLEMENT UNITS

On November 24, Israel's Jerusalem Municipality advanced plans to build 9,000 settlement units on the site of the Kalandiya Airport in the occupied Palestinian West Bank.

The proposal is now set to be considered by the District Committee for Planning and Building, under the auspices of the Finance Ministry.

The project will transform the 124-hectare airport site, which operated from 1924 to 2000, into a new settlement, with parks, hotels, public buildings, commercial areas and housing.

A delegation of European Union officials visited the site. The EU Representative to Palestine, Sven Kuhn von Burgsdorff, said that the plan jeopardized a potential two-state resolution to the conflict and helped sever Jerusalem from the West Bank.

PALESTINE & COVID-19

CURRENT STATUS

There have been so far over 432,921 confirmed cases of COVID, 424,754 recovery cases and 4,558 deaths.

New COVID-19 infections appear to be slowing down across the oPt particularly in the West Bank, while over three quarters of all active cases remaining in Gaza.

The overall Case Fatality Rate (CFR) across oPt remains at 1%.

PSYCHOLOGY SPA


MEET ONE OF THE SPECIALIZED AND UNIQUE NGO IN PALESTINE

A BOOK TO READ

INTIMATE REFLECTIONS: THE ART OF VERA TAMARI



Edited by: Penny Johnson and Anita Vitullo

This book presents the art of Vera Tamari and her impact on arts in Palestine. Tamari is recognized as one of the West Bank's leading artists. She has had solo exhibitions in Ramallah and Jerusalem, and took part in international group exhibitions such as Forces of Change: Artists of the Arab World, which was shown at The National Museum of Women in the Arts, Washington, DC, in 1994; New Visions: Art from the Occupied Territories, shown in Amman, Jordan, Salerno, Italy, and both Bonn and Frankfurt, Germany in 1989 and 1990; Tallat: Palestinian Women's Exhibition, in Jerusalem in 1986; the Third World Artists Exhibition in London in 1981; and Women Arab Artists, which was shown in Baghdad, Iraq in 1980. More recently, her work was featured in the Made in Palestine exhibition that toured the United States in 2006.

Tamari primarily works with clay, including bas-reliefs, sculptural installations, and what she calls sculpted paintings. In 1975 she became the first artist to establish a ceramics studio in the West Bank.

In 1977, the General Assembly called for the annual observance of 29 November as the International Day of Solidarity with the Palestinian People (resolution 32/40 B). In resolution 60/37 of 1 December 2005, the Assembly requested the Committee on the Exercise of the Inalienable Rights of the Palestinian People and the Division for Palestinian Rights, as part of the observance of the International Day of Solidarity with the Palestinian People on 29 November, to continue to organize an annual exhibit on Palestinian rights or a cultural event in cooperation with the Permanent Observer Mission of Palestine to the UN.

REHABILITATION OF DAR AL-CONSUL – FROM ANCIENT RUINS TO MODERN PALESTINIAN CENTRES



- by The Rehabilitation of Dar Al Consul into a Residential and Civic Complex, which started in 2014, wrapped up its activities.
 - Dar Al Consul served for three decades as a Prussian consulate and residence for the Consul. Henceforth, the building was named Dar Al-Consul, the House of the [Prussian] Consul, a name that has been retained in oral tradition until today.
- On November 26, Filasteen The project provided an opportunity to 40 undergraduate and graduate students gain on-the-job-training and capacity development experience by engaging in the rehabilitation works and operational components of the project.
- Palestine in 2021, which was On the cultural side, the project included the excavation and preservation of archeological treasures. Five main findings are now on display on the site, giving life to ruins such as cisterns, mosaic floors, private bath and water channels from the Roman, Byzantine, Late Islamic, and Mamluk times.
