3,557 NEW ILLEGAL SETTLEMENTS IN OCCUPIED JERUSALEM

Israel approved plans for building 3,557 new illegal settlement units in occupied Jerusalem.

"One plan is between Har Homa and Givat Hamatos, and the other plans are on the edge of French Hill towards Mount Scopus.

The plan that is located south of Kibbutz Ramat Rachel near Givat Hamatos and Har Homa includes building a new illegal settlement 1,465 settlement According to Peace Now, the new settlement "is intended to connect the settlement of Har Homa with Givat Hamatos and complete the Israeli southern ring that will block the potential Palestinian continuum between the Palestinian neighborhoods in East Jerusalem and Bethlehem."

ISRAELI OCCUPATION IMPACT IN 2021

According to B'Tselem the Israeli rights group report, the Israeli occupation forces killed 313 Palestinians in the occupied West Bank and Gaza Strip, including 71 minors. The report stated that 236 in the Gaza Strip, mostly during the Israel offensive on Gaza between 11 and 21 May, and 77 in the occupied West Bank, including East Jerusalem.

Israeli occupation demolished 295 Palestinian residential structures in occupied territories in 2021, leaving 895 Palestinians, 463 of them minors, homeless. The Israeli occupation forces have arrested 75 Palestinians in total last year at the Erez Crossing.

In general, the impact aggressive attacks reached the different levels of the Palestinian society through the occupation forces and the Israeli settlers; thus, affecting the wellbeing of the people, violating all human rights and even affecting the environment.

THIS IS HOW ISRAEL WELCOMES THE NEW YEAR

Israeli occupation forces demolished a Palestinian health centre serving 20,000 Palestinians in occupied East Jerusalem without prior notice.

Municipality bulldozers raided the Jabal Al-Mukaber neighbourhood after police cordoned the area off and demolished the health centre.

An appeal has previously been submitted to the Israeli courts to stop the demolition order. However, the municipality did not wait for the court's decision and sent its crews without notice.

MEET DR. EDWARD SAID



Edward W. Said was born in Jerusalem the capital of Palestine on I November 1936 and died on 25 September 2003 in New York City.


In 1948, the Said family was expropriated of all their assets, and the young Edward became a refugee deciding to fight for the rights of the Palestinian people.

He became a professor of English and Comparative Literature at Columbia University in New York. Trained at Princeton and Harvard, Said taught over one hundred and fifty universities and schools in the United States, Canada, Europe. Since his thesis on Joseph Conrad, he dealt with colonialism, and he was among the first to introduce radical criticism to the western humanism of Michel Foucault in the USA. He received an international academic fame after a typically post-structuralist entitled "Beginnings: book Intention and Method" (on the topic of the beginning and the impossibility of origin), along with the fundamentals of Orientalism.

THE OLD CITY OF BETHLEHEM

The traditional architecture of the old city of Bethlehem dates to the Ottoman period in Palestine (1515 1917) and is constructed over the remains of buildings from the previous eras. A stroll through the historic center of Bethlehem offers beautiful views of curvy stone streets, sometimes topped by rocky arches, and of domed houses with beautifully ornamented doors, windows, and smaller openings.

Some of the old residential buildings are still inhabited by the local Bethlehemite community, who are largely the descendants of the seven family clans that used to make up the original social fabric of the town. The old core of Bethlehem consists of seven historical quarters.
