- 3 Palestinians killed (2 minors)

# 211 RIGHTS GROUPS CALL FOR RESPECTING AMNESTY REPORT

211 rights groups and NGOs called for the international community to respect Amnesty International's report which labelled Israel an apartheid state.

In a joint statement, the rights groups and NGOs also called for respecting other similar reports, considering them international documents to be used in prosecuting Israel for its crimes of discrimination and racism against Palestinians.

The rights groups and NGOs considered the denial of the facts in these reports as a form of animosity towards Palestinians and denial of their inalienable rights.

At the same time, they condemned any parties or individuals who denied that Israel is practicing apartheid against Palestinians.

# JUDAIZING IBRAHIMI MOSQUE

Israeli army is continuing its attacks on the Ibrahimi Mosque in the occupied West Bank city of Hebron, with the aim of Judaising it and changing its features, in order to serve illegal settlers.

The new Israeli measures in the vicinity of the mosque, including the recent erection of a number of tents, contravene all laws, as the mosque is on the UNESCO World Heritage List, and therefore must be preserved.

The Israeli army has installed an escalator that is longer and wider than a previous one that was removed." This facilitates settler access "to a place located in the eastern corner of the mosque, where they perform religious rituals

### MEET DR. HANAN ASHRAWI




Hanan Ashrawi is said to be one of the most well-known Palestinian female politician and has spent her life advocating on behalf of the Palestinian people, particularly Palestinian women.

She was born in Ramallah in 1946 and has been active in Palestinian civil society since her early years founding the Palestinian Initiative for the Promotion of Global Dialogue and Democracy (MIFTAH), as well as establishing a name for herself in academia as Dean of the Faculty of Arts at Birzeit University.

Later on, she came to international prominence as the spokesperson for the Palestinian delegation to the Madrid and Washington peace talks. She continued to occupy a prominent position within the Palestinian government as a member of the Palestinian Legislative Council. Dr. Hanan is the first woman elected to the Palestinian National Council.

#### A BOOK TO READ

PALESTINIAN WOMEN: NARRATIVE HISTORIES AND GENDERED MEMORY



FATMA KASSEM

Palestinian Women is the first book to examine and document the experiences and the historical narrative of ordinary Palestinian women who witnessed the events of 1948 and became involuntary citizens of the State of Israel.

Told in their own words, the women's experiences serve as a window for examining the complex intersections of gender, nationalism and citizenship in a situation of ongoing violent political conflict.

Known in Palestinian discourse as the 'Nakbeh', or the 'Catastrophe', these events of 60 years ago still have a powerful resonance in contemporary Palestinian-Jewish relations in the State of Israel and in the act of narrating these stories, the author argues that the realm of memory is a site of commemoration and resistance.



#### **EXHIBITIONS**

The opening of the exhibition *And* We Still Follow Its Path, organized by Khalil Sakakini Cultural Center and Palestinian Art Court - al Hoash. The exhibition encompasses to artistic projects by 13 artists from all over Palestine, presenting personal and collective narratives centered on Jerusalem through their featured works that challenge colonial narratives and bring about multi-layered stories of personal intimacies, nostalgic imaginaries, and local narratives. The exhibition is curated by Rawan Sharaf and includes interactive participatory works that invite the audience into becoming active contributors to the process constructing the city's narratives. The exhibition runs till May 9, 2022.

#### **LECTURES**

Occupied Waves (in Arabic), prepared and presented Haneen Saleh, with research done by Marah Khalifa, organized by the Palestinian Museum in partnership with Sawt to present the stories and personal experiences of three Palestinian fishermen, one under siege in Gaza, one under siege in Jisr al-Zarqa, and a refugee in Sidon. # THE GREEN **GIRLS**



- Close to the Apartheid Wall erected by Israel on the Gaza frontier, Aseel Al-Najjar, 28, rents land in Khuza'a, east of Khan Younis along with Nadine Abu Rouk and Ghaida Qudeih where they started their project "The Green Girls"
- The group succeeded through their tireless work throughout the year in turning an area of eight acres into beautiful green piece of land.
- East of Deir Al-Balah. another group of young headed Amani Bashir, 3o, is utilizing their family's land to turn it into a source of income.

# WOMEN CARPENTERS IN GAZA

Seven girls from a Bedouin village in the northern Gaza Strip were able to break with tradition and establish themselves carpenters, making educational tools for schools.

This is a result of the Zeina Association and Cooperative for Handicraft in Beit Hanun in the northern Gaza Strip's training, which helps the women safely operate tools and make a living out of it.

Ghadeer Tayeh uses the shear saw to make educational toys for children with special needs, wooden pendants and strawberry packing boxes for farmers. Many of the items the ladies make were previously imported into Gaza, but can now be made locally.
