UN: ISRAEL HOUSING POLICIES AMOUNT TO RACIAL SEGREGATION

UN experts reported that Israel's housing policies in East Jerusalem amount to "racial segregation and discrimination" against the Palestinian people and a violation of their human rights.

The experts made their assessment based on witnessed cases where Palestinians have been subject to "discriminatory zoning and planning". These restrict access to housing, safe drinking water and sanitation and other essential services, including healthcare and educational facilities.

"The discriminatory zoning and planning regime in East Jerusalem, which prioritises zoning for Israeli settlements and limits housing options for Palestinians, clearly amounts to segregation based on race, colour, descent or national or ethnic origin," the experts said in a statement.

AL-AQSA MOSQUE UNDER MOST BRUTAL ATTACKS

Al-Aqsa Mosque is under brutal attacks to change the status quo of the mosque.

UN's Special Coordinator for the Middle East Peace Process, Tor Wennesland, called for maintaining the status quo in Jerusalem.

During his monthly brief to the UN Security Council, he said: "I reiterate that political, religious and community leaders on all sides must continue to do their part to reduce tensions, uphold the status quo at the Holy Sites... In the occupied West Bank and Israel, 23 Palestinians, including three women and four children, were killed by Israeli security forces during demonstrations, clashes, search-andarrest operations, attacks and alleged attacks against Israelis, and other incidents, and 541 Palestinians, including 30 women and 80 children, were injured," he said.

There have been so far over 582,119 confirmed cases of COVID, 576,684 recovery cases and 5,657 deaths.


MEET SHIREEN ABU AKLEH



Shireen Abu Akleh was a Palestinian-American journalist who worked as a reporter for the Arabic-language channel of Al Jazeera for 25 years, and was a well-known name across the Middle East for her decades of reporting in the Israeli-occupied Palestinian territories. She was shot and killed on May 11, 2022, while covering an Israel raid on the West Bank city of Jenin.

Abu Akleh was one of the Arab world's leading journalists, a veteran reporter who was described after her death as having been "among Arab media's most prominent figures". Her career included reporting on major Palestinian events including the Second Intifada as well as analyzing Israeli politics; her live reporting on television and distinct signoffs were wellknown, and she inspired many other Palestinians and Arabs to pursue careers in journalism.

NAKBA: PALESTINE AND THE CLAIMS OF MEMORY

For outside observers, current events in Israel, Gaza, and the West Bank are seldom related to the collective memory of ordinary Palestinians. But for Palestinians themselves, the iniquities of the present are experienced as a continuous replay of the injustice of the past.

By focusing on memories of the Nakba or "catastrophe" of 1948, in which hundreds of thousands of Palestinians were dispossessed to create the state of Israel, the contributors to this volume illuminate the contemporary Palestinian experience and clarify the moral claims they make for justice and redress.

The book's essays consider the ways in which Palestinians have remembered and organized themselves around the Nakba, a central trauma that continues to be refracted through Palestinian personal and collective memory. Analyzing oral histories and written narratives, poetry and cinema, personal testimony and courtroom evidence, the authors show how the continuing experience of violence. occupation displacement, and transformed the pre-Nakba past and the land of Palestine into symbols of what has been and continues to be lost.

NAKBA DAY

MAY 15 1948

The Nakba, catastrophe, refers to the day the Jewish gangs waged a war against the indigenous Palestinians on May 15, 1948, immediately after Britain declared an end to its mandate and occupation of Palestine.


The war ended shortly after, where the gangs occupied most of Palestine forcing more than half of its population to leave their homes and become refugees in their own country or in neighboring countries. More than 400 cities and towns were systematically destroyed by Israeli forces or repopulated with Jews.

Nakba 1948 - Present

It has been 75 years since the Nakba, or the Catastrophe, and Palestinians are marking the day this year amid Israeli attacks on occupied lands that has never ceased to stop. The Nakba resulted in the displacement of nearly 800,000 Palestinians out of 1.4 million Palestinians who lived in historical Palestine in 1948 in 1,300 villages and towns.

An Electronic model of the old city of Jerusalem has been launched in Jerusalem Hotel.


