Israel declares: 'high possibility' its army killed Shireen Abu Akleh

The Israeli occupation army admitted for the first time that there is a (high possibility) that the Palestinian journalist was killed by a soldier's gunshot (By Mistake) while covering an Israeli military operation in the Jenin camp last May. The martyr's family rejected the results of this Israeli investigation and demanded a "comprehensive, independent investigation by the International Criminal Court". The Israeli government are trying to obscure the truth. We have known for more than 4 months that an Israeli soldier shot and killed Shireen, which is the conclusion of countless investigations conducted by CNN, the Associated Press, the New York Times, Al-Jazeera, Al-Haq (Palestinian human rights), B'Tselem (Israeli human rights), the United Nations, and others.

The United Nations Commemorates the 75th anniversary of Palestinians' (Nakba)

For the first time in its history, the United Nations officially commemorated the anniversary of the Nakba "catastrophe" of Palestine in 1948, which was attended by many member states from all over the world, and the Palestinian president, Mahmoud Abbas, who delivered a speech. Also, photographs, videos and testimonials were shown about Israeli violations against our people, from demolition, displacement and settlement. In addition, they presented the situation of refugees and the camps and their hope for return. "The year 1948 was a pivotal year in the history of the Palestinian people; it was the beginning of the exile, millions of refugees, the beginning of the eradication of entire families from their homes and lands, and currently, the Palestinian people are still suffering from continuous occupation and settlement, and the Nakba continues", said the chairman of the committee, Mr Cheikh Niang, And The president of the 77th session of the United Nations, Mr Csaba Kőrösi, said: "The International Commission Supports the Palestinian Rights to independence and return".

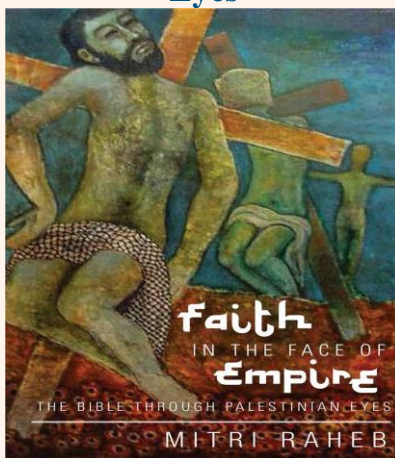
Meet: {Prof. Munir Nayfeh}



A Palestinian atomic scientist, he owns 23 patents in the manufacture of silicon nanoparticles, and he is a former nominee for the Nobel Prize in Physics. Munir was born in 1945 in the city of Tulkarm / Palestinian. He obtained his doctorate from Stanford University, USA, in 1970, where he specialized in atomic physics and laser science. Nayfeh has published over 130 articles and scientific papers in medicine, industrial and military engineering, and nuclear technologies.

The Washington Post announced that he is establishing a new branch in chemistry called "Single Atom Chemistry", which paves the way for a medical breakthrough that contributes to many diseases that science has been powerless to treat for years. Dr Nayfeh is head of the network of Arab scientists and technologists abroad. And he is a member of the Board of Directors of the Arab Foundation for Science and Technology, an institution concerned with developing joint scientific projects that contribute to solving problems the Arab region suffers from.

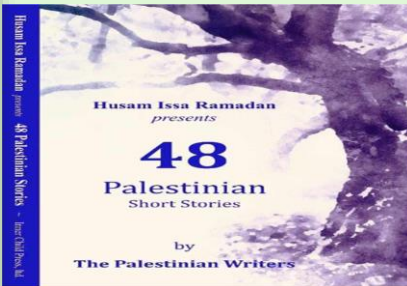


SPORTS**Palestinian horse rider won first place in the Budapest International Show Jumping Championship**
