Occupation this month in Numbers

- \* 17 Palestinians were killed (including 2 children)
- \* 293 Palestinian injured (including 7 critical conditions, 8 children, 3 journalists, & 2 elderly)
- \* **245**detainees (including 10 Children)
- \* 8 cases of residential premises, and 2 commercial facilities in the West Bank and Jerusalem.
- \* 8 Notices of house demolition.
- \* The occupation bulldozes an archaeological area south of Bethlehem
- \*30 houses, more than 60 cars, and 50 agricultural facilities were burned by Israeli settler militias in Turmus Ayya, Ramallah
- \* Burning a mosque in Nablus
- 275 plots were seized by Israel
- \* 295 olive trees were uprooted
- \* 4,247 illegal settlement unites to be establishment in an announcement and a new illegal settlement outpost was erected in the West Bank.

#### Occupation attempts to Judaize Palestinian flowers

The occupation has begun to publish the names of plants rooted in Palestine in Hebrew on the Internet pages and attribute them to Israeli origins; An example of this is the flower "Red Everlasting", which they changed its name to "flower of the Maccabees" to give it a Hebrew character.

The Judaization projected its motivations on the "Iris flower", which spread in the villages of Fagu'a and Jalboun in Jenin/West Bank. It is the only region in the world where this unique flower grows, so its name is associated with the name of that region, where it is "Iris Faqqu'a". known as Environmental experts point out that this flower has settled in Palestine since ancient times. The occupation authorities are trying to Judaize the iris, but the institutional and Palestinian efforts succeeded in 2017 in fixation the Palestinian name for the flower.

## Collective hunger strike ... A difficult way to acquire detainees' basic rights

The open hunger strike is the most dangerous and cruel decision that the detainees might take. Such a decision entails grave dangers that sometimes would lead to death. That was the case with a number of Palestinian detainees who lost their lives, starting with martyr Abdel "Qader Abu al-Fahm", who passed away on 7/11/1970 as a direct result of his decision to undergo a hunger strike, during the strike in Ashkelon prison. The last case was "Khader Adnan" who died on a hunger strike on 2/5/2023. Among known demands detainees seek are: Ending the policy of administrative detention and solitary confinement, stopping attacks storming detainees' rooms and sections, allowing family visits, especially their children, improving medical treatment for patients and eliminating individual and collective punishments against them. According to the head of the Palestinian Prisoner's Society, Qaddoura Fares: Palestinian detainees succeeded through 26 collective strikes in achieving and extracting many demands that changed the conditions of their lives and imposed a reality that preserves their dignity.

# Meet the: "Trio Joubran"



Music means, for many people, a balm that heals wounds and a link that brings us together despite our different cultures, backgrounds, and affiliations. Music gives hope for a better life for people who have suffered the bitterness of displacement and injustice. Music represents hope and a dream for a better tomorrow for Palestinian people who are still under occupation.

The Trio Joubran is an artistic boom that started in the Arab world and extended to the entire universe. A Palestinian oud band from the city of Nazareth. This trio consists of the brothers Joubran, Samir (1973), Wissam (1983) and Adnan (1985). All of them are proficient in composing music and playing the oud instrument, while the middle brother manufactures their instruments, a craft that he inherited from his father and developed by studying at the Antonio Stradivari Institute in Italy. It is the first band in the history of Oriental music to include three oud players. The trio took Paris as their place of residence, from which they moved and roamed the world. They are famous for their artistic career and musical weapon in opposing the occupation for the sake of the Palestinian cause. The impressive successes and numerous international and regional awards won by this band made it shine and dazzle many worldwide.

#### A BOOK TO READ:

**Against the Loveless World**

Susan Abulhawa is a Palestinian writer, human rights activist, and animal rights advocate. She has many books translated to more than thirty languages. She lives in Pennsylvania and she is the founder of the NGO (Playgrounds for Palestine).

**Against the Loveless World**: A novel divided into seven parts, starting with the trial of the Palestinian "Nahr", The novel's heroine, in an Israeli court. It was surprising that the trial was conducted entirely in Hebrew. Nahr did not find out that she would go to prison or even the nature of her alleged crime. It then cuts to a cell scene from the "technological marvel" where Nahr is imprisoned after her trial in an almost fully automated solitary cell popular with "security circles", surveillance technology companies and various suppliers of slavery methods. Her charge was "terrorism" - as if the Israeli political imagination allows for less. As the novel draws to a close, the reader is already well acquainted with Nahr's character - and the pleasure she takes in dragging Israelis into a whirl of bewilderment through unconventional behavior and surprising in the courtroom. She began performing a mixture of Arabic songs, hoping to make her husband Bilal - arrested several times and is a model of resistance - proud of her wherever he is.
