Israel attempts to steal the “Kufiya” the symbol of Palestine and its heritage

Israel continues to steal Palestinian heritage, adorn it, adapt it to its economic and cultural interests, and market it as Israeli. The latest robbery of the heritage property of Palestine was represented when Israeli models appeared during the “Tel Aviv Fashion Week” wearing the “**Palestinian Kufiya**” in white and red, and the other in black and white. The Kufiya is considered a symbol of Palestinian liberation from the Israeli occupation, and part of the culture and folklore of the Palestinian people throughout their existence in historical Palestine. Its name is also associated with the national struggle since the 1936 revolution. The Kufiya has been very popular around the world in recent years, as wearing it has become a common sight during protests around the world as a symbol of solidarity with Palestine against Israel's crimes.

The late Palestinian President Yasser Arafat gave a global dimension to the Kufiya, he wore it all the time throughout his leadership.

The "Foreign Ministry" calls for effective international intervention to Stop the Occupation's Crimes

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs and expatriates called on the international community to intervene quickly to stop the ongoing Israeli aggression against our people, their land, property and sanctities, and to provide international protection for the Palestinian people in general and for Jerusalem and its sanctities and Al-Aqsa in particular.

In a press statement, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs condemned the storming of the occupation forces and settlers into Palestinian cities, especially Jenin and Nablus, which led to the death of dozens of men, women and children, and the injury of hundreds of innocent citizens. Also condemned settler incursions into Al-Aqsa Mosque and religious, archaeological and historical sites and shrines in the West Bank, demolitions and delivery of notices to demolish Palestinian homes and facilities committed by the occupation forces in areas classified as "C-Zone".

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs held the Israeli occupation government fully responsible for these violations and crimes, and warned of their dangers on the conflict arena, and called for serious international positions to compel the occupying state to stop all its unilateral measures.

Meet: Maha Abu Dayyeh

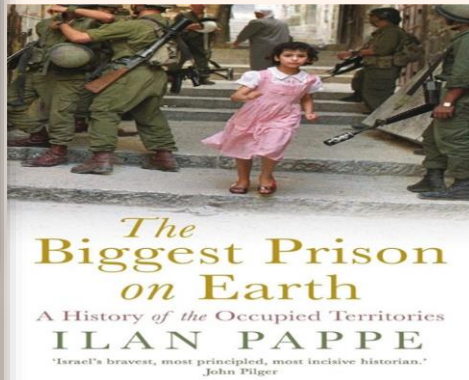


The pioneering feminist Maha Abu Dayyeh was born in Jerusalem on 1951. She obtained a Bachelor's degree in English language and history from a university in the United States of America. She served as director of the Quakers Center for Legal Services; It is the first center to provide legal aid to Palestinians in Israeli prisons.

Abu Dayyah was known for her great activity in the feminist field. She worked on establishing the "Women's Center for Legal and Social Counseling" during the outbreak of the first Palestinian Intifada, in 1991. The center concerned with the social issues of Palestinian women, and works to enhance the role of women in public life, especially in the political field, within the struggle movement for the rights of the Palestinian people.

Abu Dayyeh also contributed to the establishment and activation of the (Council of Palestinian Human Rights Organizations). and contributed to the support of other local, regional and international institutions; She was a member of the board of directors of a number of Palestinian human rights institutions, including: The Agricultural Relief Society in Jerusalem, The Jerusalem Center for Legal Aid and Human Rights; She was also a board member of an international jury advocating for the rights of women. In 2014, she was elected on the Board of Commissioners of the Palestinian Independent Commission for Human Rights. she won many international awards, such as: "The French State Award for Human Rights" in the year 1998, and the "Woman of the Year Award 2002" in the United States.

A BOOK TO READ: The Biggest Prison on Earth: A History of the Occupied Territories

Through documents revealed for the first time, the Israeli historian Ilan Pappé provides tangible proof that the 1967 war was not an inevitable result of the escalation of tension between Israel and each of Syria and Egypt, as conveyed by the well-known historical narrative. The speed at which the battle was decided, and the governance mechanism that was put into effect immediately after the fighting, raise legitimate questions about the reality of what was planned.. In fact, neither the United Nations resolutions of 1948 that confiscated 78% of the land of Palestine, nor all the world's complicity, were sufficient factors to satisfy the Zionists' greed for control over what they consider part of their historical homeland, that is, the West Bank and the Gaza Strip. They held several meetings in the black rooms, and put in plans to occupy them and expel the Palestinians from them, after nearly two decades, the Israelis began to turn the West Bank and the Gaza Strip into a large prison, and the Palestinians became a people without an identity, rights, or the basics of living, whose land was being torn apart by the planted settlements.

That secret plan is still being implemented today, as Israel has succeeded in emptying all peace initiatives of their content, and it is exploiting every Palestinian expression of anger to grab more lands, and escalate violence, humiliation and genocide with the aim of establishing a Jewish state of ethnic purity.
