#### Occupation this month In Numbers

- \*18 Palestinians were killed (including 3 children)
- \* 243 Palestinian injured (including 11 critical cases, 4 children, and a man with special needs)
- \* **296** detainees (including 11 Children, and 3 women)
- \* A settler runs over a disabled boy and girl in the city of Hebron
- \* Bombing and targeting peaceful marches in the eastern Gaza Strip, wounding 31 and killing a child
- \* Armed settlers attack a 10 European diplomatic delegation during their tour in the Bedouin Al-Siq Valley.
- \*Dozens of female students suffocated from toxic tear gas, which was fired by the Israeli army towards their School in Hebron
- \*Demolishing 19 residential homes, and 55 commercial establishments in the West Bank and Jerusalem
- \* Notice of demolition of 117 house and commercial establishments
- \* The occupation confiscates 893 plots of land in the West Bank and Jerusalem
- \* Uprooting 472 olive trees.

## UNESCO includes the ancient city of (Jericho) on the World Heritage List

The United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) included the ancient city of Jericho (Tell Sultan) on its World Heritage List following a vote by the UN World Heritage Committee on Sunday, without objection from any member state.

Jericho is considered one of the

oldest cities in Canaanite Palestine. **About the importance of the site:** it "represents the exceptional civilization of the first successful permanent model of human settlements, and represents the oldest walled agricultural city in the world built more than 10 thousand years ago in the lowest spot on the Earth's surface (250 meters below Sea level). In a statement, the Palestinian Ministry of Foreign Affairs welcomed UNESCO'S decision and called for "preserving Palestine and its World Heritage Sites and protecting them from deliberate sabotage attempts by the occupation authorities and its tools."

### The International Day of Solidarity with Palestinian Journalists



On the 26 September each year, the Palestinian people commemorate the International Day of Solidarity with the Palestinian Journalists (since the International Federation approved it on the 26 of September 1996.) The latest statement by the Palestinian Journalists Syndicate showed that Palestinian journalists are living their worst and harshest days due to the Israeli attacks, terrorism, arrests, and intimidation. The Palestinian Journalists Syndicate affirmed that it will work by all legitimate means to defend fellow journalists and media professionals and their rights and freedoms and to work to prevent violators of press freedom and aggressors from escaping punishment, especially the crime of assassinating our colleague, the martyr Shireen Abu Akleh, Shireen Abu Akleh, and two colleagues, Yasser Murtaja and Ahmed Abu Hussein, in addition to their continuous targeting and destruction of media institutions in the West Bank and Gaza Strip.

## Meet: Palestinian Singer and Activist "Rim El-Banna"



A Palestinian singer, composer, and activist for justice and freedom. She was famous for her patriotic and committed songs derived from Palestinian heritage and was called "The Voice of Palestinian Cause."

Rim Banna was born in 1966 in Nazareth. northern-occupied Palestine. She is the daughter of the Palestinian poet Zahira Sabbagh. She graduated from the Higher Institute of Music in Moscow's Russian capital in 1991. Rim started singing professionally in childhood and continued. She released 13 singing albums dominated by national Palestinian folklore. especially singing for children. She conveyed her voice to the Palestinians in the occupation prisons, camps, and wherever the Palestinians present.

During her artistic career, Rim received several awards, the most important being honored of the Year Personality and Ambassador of Peace in Italy in 1994, and The Personality Award of the Year from the Tunisian Ministry of Culture in 1997. She also won the Palestine Singing Award in 2000, and the Ibn Rushd Prize for Freedom of Thought in 2013.

Rim was chosen as the Palestinian Cultural Personality in 2016 in recognition of her long career in singing for Palestine and its children. El-Banna died in 2018, at the age of 52, in a hospital in the city of Nazareth. The Palestinian Ministry of Culture mourned her and said that with her passing, "Palestine lost a great artist who vowed to raise the voice of Palestine and make it heard by the world. She dedicated herself to the cause of its people through word and voice, stressing that art is also a tool of the liberation struggle."

#### Reclaiming Humanity in Palestinian Hunger Strikes

Revolutionary Subjectivity and Decolonizing the Body

The Middle East Foundation (Rasd) announced, in a special ceremony held in London, that the academic research entitled "Restoring Humanity in the Hunger Strike Experience in Palestine: Revolutionary Self Decolonizing the Body" won the Best Palestinian Book Award for the year 2022, by sociology researcher Dr. Ashjan Ajour. Notably, 51 books were submitted to the competition via the Middle East Monitor (MEMO), nine of which were selected for nomination, and this book won the competition award this year.

The researcher, Dr. Ajour, conducted 85 interviews based on an extended field trip, which included freed prisoners who experienced hunger strikes in Israeli prisons at different stages of time and with their families, lawyers, and representatives of the Palestinian Prisoner's Society and the Palestinian political parties, during the period between 2015 and 2018, it mainly targeted those who went on strike to protest political detention.

Dr. Ajour aimed to prepare this research to fill the gap in the special literature on the experience of Palestinian prisoners in resisting the colonizer through hunger strikes as a central historical tool of struggle, despite the presence of some literature that dealt with the experience in a general framework about the struggle of the prisoner movement, in addition to the increasing phenomenon of strikes.
